Tishe B'Av Study Session


An enthusiastic group of CAS folks attended a study session led by longtime member John Slote on August 10th at the synagogue. John began the morning by distributing an informative handout as we explored the text and themes of Tishe B'Av, the ninth of Av, the fifth month of the Hebrew lunar calendar.

John explained that "Lamentations (*Eicha* in Hebrew) is a difficult and challenging text that is traditionally recited on the 9th of Av in communal mourning for great historical disasters experienced by the Jewish people. The text itself is difficult on many levels. So is the thinking behind the ritual. However, like many of the difficult moments in our tradition, I think it is worth directly engaging with the words, the meaning behind them, and the religious holiday of Tishe B'Av itself."

Attendees took turns reading selections out loud and there was much general discussion about each section. Many positive comments were voiced at the conclusion of the morning study session, with great enthusiasm expressed for continuing with programs such as this one.

Afterwards, a number of members of the Wednesday morning Café Kehillah group gathered for a delightful lunch at the Aegean Breeze restaurant.


